Join the June 18 Field Day at Foxfire Farm in Liberty, KY

Don't miss OAK's Farmer Field Day at Foxfire Farm in Casey County next Tuesday! Foxfire Farm is a 2.5acre, certified organic, low-till farm that cultivates greens, herbs, roots and diverse vegetables. They sell their produce through a wide array of markets, including a local community supported agriculture (CSA) program, farmers markets, restaurants, groceries and wholesale buyers. Aaron and Irina Lange steward the Lange family land, combining intergenerational knowledge and experience with bio-intensive and ecologically-minded practices, like cover cropping, integrating livestock and maintaining permanent beds with crop rotations. Aaron will provide demonstrations and specific crop examples for harvest techniques, wash-pack systems, crop transitions and bed-flipping. He will also share lessons learned about building and balancing multiple market channels. Registration is \$5 for OAK Members, \$10 for non-members.
