Farmer Profile: Joseph Monroe, Valley Spirit Farm

Joseph Monroe and Abbie Scott-Monroe live and farm on 118 acres in Henry County, where they raise three young kids, steward the land with respect and a light touch and integrate community throughout their work. Farming roots run deep for both of their families, and it's evident in the life they share with their children, farm crew and neighboring community. Valley Spirit Farm began with the merging of two farm families, the Monroes and Feichters, who worked together to develop the systems that Joseph and Abbie still manage: 100 acres of grass-fed cattle and seven acres of diverse vegetable production.



In 2023, the Monroes' farm partners Caleb and Kelly Feichter moved north to be closer to family, and Joseph and Abbie continued the farm, simplifying the enterprises (no more hogs or mushrooms) but maintaining their core practices. Joseph and Annie were among the first farmers to join The Berry Center's Our Home Place Meat cooperative. They also vend at the Douglass Loop Farmers Market in Louisville and contribute to the Local Food Purchase Assistance (LFPA) program and New Roots Fresh Stop Markets.

With an eye towards stewarding the land for their children and protecting the natural resources, Joseph and Abbie have worked to build and maintain healthy soil and incorporate conservation practices throughout their farm. They work to protect riparian areas around waterways with native vegetation, establish native pollinator habitat and grasslands and use organic practices in their vegetable production. Their cattle pastures are actively managed with adaptive grazing techniques including rotational grazing, improved forages and periods of rest or disturbance based on continual experimentation and observation of the animals and their pastures. As a farm participant in OAK's USDA-supported Climate-Smart Farming Project, Valley Spirit Farm has committed to implementing climate-smart practices and assessing whole-farm sustainability.

Joseph and Abbie will share their farm, highlight their cattle and pasture management and explain their conservation practices at the upcoming OAK Farmer Field Day. OAK is grateful for their time and generosity in welcoming the farming community to Valley Spirit Farm on September 23rd.

Farm-Partner Profile: Seedleaf

Seedleaf is a community gardening organization that provides horticultural training and supports the practice of gardening and small-scale farming in the urban spaces of Lexington, Kentucky. Their mission supports development of a robust and healthy local food economy and a just and equitable system of urban land stewardship. Through the year-long Market Garden Program, Seedleaf guides participants through basic horticultural principles, food safety practices and general business planning. Once their instruction is complete, Seedleaf provides the Market Gardeners with land for their own vegetable production at Seedleaf's newly-acquired 30-acre farm, Headwater Farm. Through sharing land, skills and resources, Seedleaf helps new Market Gardeners take risks, build their brands and learn while minimizing financial barriers and social isolation. The Market Gardeners keep all proceeds they earn from their efforts.

Headwater Farm is located at the headwaters of the Elkhorn Creek in Northeast Lexington. Beyond graduated market gardeners and farmers in training, Headwater currently provides land access and shares resources with the Refugee Farmers Cooperative (Empucate) and the Nepalese farming organization, Anka. Headwater is also home to Seedleaf's new agroforestry program and a burgeoning food forest. Seedleaf is committed to nurturing the land, growing nutrient dense food and increasing biodiversity for and with the community it serves.

Organic Certification Cost Share Program

Organic Certification Cost Share Program (OCCSP) is available for operations submitting applications or renewing certification. OCCSP provides cost share assistance to producers and handlers of agricultural products who are obtaining or renewing their certification under the National Organic Program (NOP). Certified operations may receive up to 75 percent of their certification costs paid during the program year, not to exceed \$750 per certification scope. The deadline to apply is October 31, 2024. Some certifiers process cost share requests through the certification application, others do not. If your certifier does not process certification cost share then you can apply for cost share through your local USDA Farm Services Agency office. Resources and Funding for Farmers

Organic Certification Cost Share Program (OCCSP) is available for operations submitting applications or renewing certification. USDA Commits Greater Conservation Assistance for Producers Transitioning to Organic Production
On April 10, 2023, the U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) announced details about its \$75 million
investment in conservation assistance for producers transitioning to organic production. The Natural
Resources Conservation Service (NRCS) is dedicating financial and technical assistance to a new organic
management standard and partnering with new organic technical experts to increase staff capacity and
expertise. NRCS will dedicate \$70 million to assist producers with a new organic management standard
under the Environmental Quality Incentives Program (EQIP). This program is for farmers who are beginning
or in the process of transitioning to organic certification. OAK is in conversation with NRCS Kentucky and
will work to communicate with farmers about the opportunity to apply for this new Organic Management

\$1 Billion Available to Help Farmers Invest in Renewable Energy

U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) Secretary Tom Vilsack announced that USDA is accepting applications starting on April 1 for \$1 billion in grants to help agricultural producers and rural small businesses invest in renewable energy systems and make energy-efficiency improvements. USDA is making the \$1 billion in grants available under the Rural Energy for America Program (REAP), with funding from President Biden's landmark Inflation Reduction Act, the nation's largest-ever investment in combating the climate crisis. Silvopasture and Forest Farming Support / Funds Available

The Catalyzing Agroforestry Grant Program is focused on implementing silvopastures and forest farming practices through direct support payments and will assist producers in designing appropriate projects using technical assistance and science-based planning strategies. The ultimate goal of the effort is to increase ecosystem sustainability and diversity by scaling up agroforestry practices. The Appalachian Beginning Forest Farming Coalition (ABFFC) project will provide up to \$1500/acre for silvopasture implementation and up to \$1000/quarter acre for forest farming implementation depending on project scale and scope. To enhance shared learning, producers who receive support will share successes and lessons-learned with their peers and other interested stakeholders. Minority, female, Indigenous, LGBTQ+, and/or socially

KSU Small Scale Farm Grant

Deadline: The 1st day of every other month

Overview: The KSU Small Scale Farm Grant is designed with the small operation farmer in mind. This grant application is relatively simple to complete and the funds can be used to purchase needed equipment related to the proposed project. To qualify, applicants must be producing a value-added product, be an organic farmer, and/or be an aquatic farmer. Farmers markets are often eligible. Previously approved projects have included canning equipment, a walk-in cooler, a water line to a hoop house, a root cellar, a cool-bot for vegetables, and a trailer for keeping meat cool and recently added farmer education assistance with a maximum of \$500.

Kentucky Proud Promotional Grant

Deadline: On-going

Funding Amount: Up to 10% annual gross farm income, max at \$8,000 per year; \$1 for \$1 match

Overview: The Kentucky Proud Promotional Grant is a cost share program to help Kentucky farmers and agribusinesses pay for advertising and marketing expenses. The award amount is based on 10% of direct farm impact; for a farmer it would be 10% of their total farm gross sales. The applicant must be a registered member of Kentucky Proud to apply and use the Kentucky Proud logo/brand in marketing efforts paid for with program funds. Examples of fundable items include TV ads, radio ads, web expenses, hats, t-shirts, demos, sampling, labels, packaging, tradeshows, UPC, and bar codes. This is a great program that helps promote our local farms!
