#### **CPFI 2024 Annual Conference & National Student Retreat**

From May 29 to June 2, 2024, the Bonclarken Conference Center in Flat Rock, North Carolina, hosted the CPFI Annual Conference and National Student Retreat. Pharmacist members traveled from 24 states, and student pharmacist members from 14 states attended the conference!

The National Student Retreat began on Wednesday afternoon and was coordinated this year by Courtney Jenkins-Lipscomb, a 2024 graduate of the Virginia Commonwealth University School of Pharmacy. 
