# **SWSP Outstanding Scientific Publication Award Nomination Deadline** December 1, 2021

The SWSP Outstanding Scientific Publication Award is presented to the most outstanding scientific published article with direct clinical relevance in periodontics. The paper should present new information which may be readily used by practitioners in the evaluation and/or management of patients with periodontal diseases.

#### Requirements:

- First, second or corresponding author must be a member of the SWSP.
- Members of the SWSP Board and SWSP Scientific Affairs Committee are not eligible. These individuals may not be the first, second or corresponding author on article submissions.

#### Articles must meet the following criteria:

- Published in a refereed scientific journal during the previous twelve months.
- Published in English.
- Directly apply to the practice of periodontics and/or dental implantology.

#### **Nomination & Selection Process:**

- Nominations are submitted to the SWSP Scientific Affairs Committee to include:
  - SWSP Award Nomination Form.
  - · Deadline is December 1st of each year.
  - The SWSP Scientific Affairs Committee make the final decision on the award recipient based on a scoring rubric to be developed.
  - The Scientific Affairs Committee notifies the SWSP Board of Directors at the Winter Board of Directors' Meeting.

### **Saturday Presenter**

Dr. Leandro Chambrone, DDS, MSc, PhD - Professor, Ibirapuera University, Sao Paolo, Brazil



Dr. Leandro Chambrone currently serves as an Adjunct Associate Professor in the Department of Periodontics at Penn Dental Medicine. He holds extensive experience in didactic teaching and clinical training of predoctoral and postgraduate (MSc and PhD) students. Dr. Chambrone serves as an Ad-honorem Associate Professor / Research Consultant at the Unit of Basic Oral Investigations at El Bosque University (Colombia), as well as Visiting Professor at the Department of Periodontology at the University of Iowa. He has developed didactical materials that have been widely used by predoctoral and postdoctoral students worldwide. He has published two textbooks, one on Periodontal Plastic Surgery for undergraduate students published in three languages (English, Portuguese and Chinese) by Springer Verlag Book Co. in 2015, and one on Decision-Making in Dental Implantology published in five languages (English, Portuguese, Chinese, Russian and Turkish). Dr. Chambrone's scientific papers are often reviewed in local and international Certificate Programs of Periodontology. Beyond his enthusiasm and dedication as a dental clinician and educator, Dr. Chambrone is also heavily involved with

clinical research and evidence-based dentistry. His publications have a high impact in current dentistry and are among the most cited articles published in 2012 and 2015 at both Journal of Clinical Periodontology and Journal of Periodontology. Recognition of his work in the field of periodontology is also demonstrated through his work as member of the Cochrane Oral Health Group and editorial board of an international dental journal (i.e. Clinical Oral Implants Research).

# Clinical Insights About the treatment of Recession-type Defects and Soft Tissue Phenotype Modification Around Teeth and Implants

Periodontal and peri-implant soft tissue augmentation plastic procedures have long been used for the treatment of gingival recession (GR) and mucogingival deformities around natural teeth and dental implants. During daily practice, clinicians are required to deal with diverse clinical scenarios and to provide the most adequate treatment options for each particular condition based on the best evidence available, the clinician's skills, and the patients' desires.

#### **Learning Objectives:**

- 1. To define the main factors influencing the predictability of root coverage procedures according to the different patient-, procedure- and outcome-related factors
- 2. To translate evidence-based findings to clinical practice, by presenting treatment approaches to the most common "clinical scenarios" related to gingival recession treatment and soft tissue phenotype modification around natural teeth and dental implants
- 3. To identify the influence of the keratinized tissue band on the long-term stability of results achieved by reconstructive soft tissue procedures
