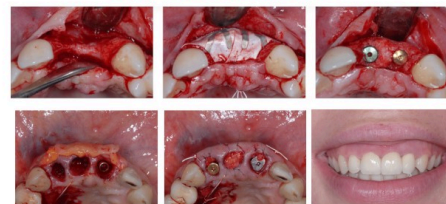

Prichard Competition Review

The 39th annual John F. Prichard Prize for Graduate Research was held on January 26, 2024, on the opening day of the 2024 SWSP Winter Meeting. The contributions made by our region's newest periodontists to the ever-evolving fields of periodontology and dental implantology were displayed during that session.

Abstracts were submitted from periodontal residents around our Southwest region. These were reviewed by our blinded judge panel represented by nine periodontists from academic and private practice settings. Four finalists were selected from a total of nine submissions. These 4 finalists competed in a single category that included projects from both clinical and basic sciences.
