Certified Organic Crop Inspector Training

This training in **Frankfort**, **KY**, **on November 4-8**, **2024**, provides successful participants all they need to become an organic crop inspector and is intended to support participation by minority and socially disadvantaged stakeholders, including immigrant farmers and small farmers who can't access the resources to pay for training. Certified organic status is not required of participants. Priority will be given to residents of Kentucky. <u>Register and Apply for the IOIA training before September 20. 2024</u>.
