Meet The Farmer: LeTicia Marshall

As a child in Southcentral Kentucky, LeTicia Marshall did chores on her grandparents' tobacco farm, hunted for wild mushrooms and watched her grandfather use catalpa worms for fishing bait at their pay lake. Now a mother and land steward of four acres in South Louisville, LeTicia is building on those early outdoor experiences for her work as an urban farmer, garden educator and food systems organizer.

Out of the turbulence and solidarity of 2020, LeTicia created <u>BearFruit & Grow, LLC</u>, cultivating an abundant 15-raised-bed backyard garden and youth education program and contributing to food justice efforts throughout Louisville. LeTicia's passion for urban gardening and empowering her community to reconnect with the land led her and her family to their current farm acreage in Southwest Louisville, along the banks of Pond Creek.

2025 Farm Service Agency County Committee Elections Open Until August 1st

The U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) is taking ballots for the Farm Service Agency (FSA) county and urban county committee elections from all eligible agricultural producers and private landowners across the country. Elections are occurring in certain Local Administrative Areas for these committee members who make important decisions about how Federal farm programs are administered locally. Individuals may nominate themselves or others and qualifying organizations may also nominate candidates. USDA - and OAK - encourage all eligible producers to nominate, vote and hold office. Producers and landowners must return ballots to their local FSA county office or have their ballots postmarked by August 1, 2025, for those ballots to be counted. Learn more here
